San Diego Creek Sediment Removal Project

OC Public Works will remove excess sediment from the San Diego Creek Channel in the City of Irvine to reduce the risk of flooding and improve flood channel water flow.

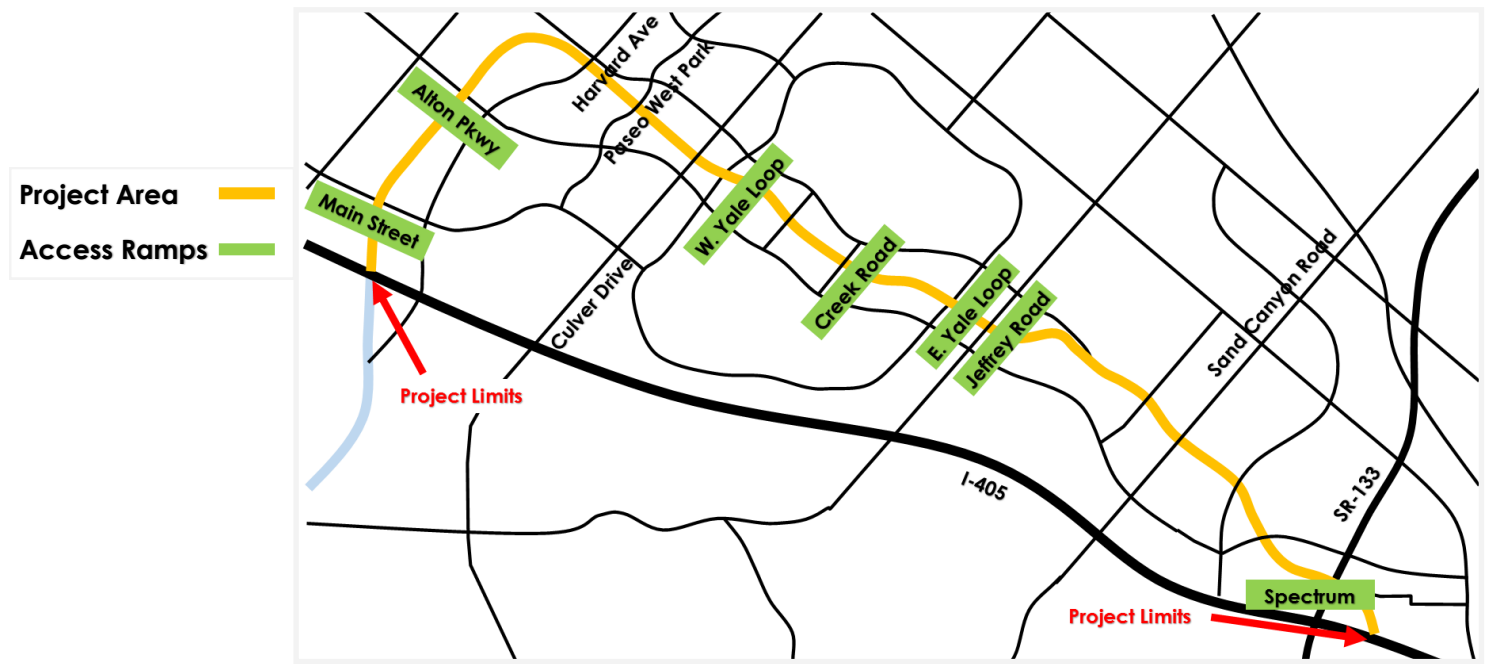


WHAT: OC Public Works will be removing approximately 200,000 cubic yards of excess sediment from the San Diego Creek channel in the City of Irvine between I-405 north of Harvard Avenue to I-405 south of State Route-133. **To perform maintenance work, project equipment will require temporary access in and out of the channel via access ramps. The bike trail may be impacted intermittently during working hours for the duration of the project.** Safety signs and personnel will be used in and around project areas to alert you of project activities and ensure your safety.

WHEN: **Project Duration:** Summer 2018 — Spring 2019
Work Days/Hours: Monday — Friday 7:00 a.m. — 7:00 p.m. and Saturday 9:00 a.m.—6:00 p.m. (If necessary)

The project duration is tentative and subject to change due to weather and other factors.

WHERE: San Diego Creek Channel in the City of Irvine between I-405 north of Harvard Avenue to I-405 south of State Route-133 and at various access points at the following locations: Main Street, Alton Parkway, W. Yale Loop, Creek Road, E. Yale Loop, Jeffrey Road, and Spectrum. See the project map below for details.
